Dear Shri Verma,

As you may be aware, that Standards for eGovernance are a high priority activity, which will help ensure sharing of information and seamless interoperability of data across eGovernance applications. Deity under NeGP is promoting the usage of Open Standards to avoid any technology lock-ins. An Institutional Mechanism has been setup under NeGP to evolve/adopt Standards for eGovernance.

- 2. An Apex Body on Standards chaired by Secretary, DeitY with senior representatives from Planning Commission, Law, Expenditure, UIDAI, NIC, NASSCOM, MAIT, BIS etc. has been constituted with a mandate to approve, notify and enforce the standards that would be formulated by various Expert Committees. NIC and STQC are playing a critical role along with DeitY in the entire process of Standardization. A website has been created on the standardization activities <a href="http://egovstandards.gov.in">http://egovstandards.gov.in</a> for any further details. List of all eGov Standards and Guideline notified by DeitY is annexed.
- 3. Following these standards would make it possible to share information across the applications. In this regard, it is requested that all Government departments and agencies involved in the implementation of eGovernance applications in India adhere to these standards for building secure and interoperable eGovernance applications which are technology and vendor neutral. It is also advised that in order for eGovernance applications to be interoperable on various platforms, it would be prudent to ensure that the solutions developed are in conformance with the technology standards notified by Deity.
